A. Statement of Compliance with Open Public Meetings Act

Minutes of a regular meeting of the Town Council of the Town of Morristown, held on May 24, 2016, in the Council Room of the Morristown Town Hall located at 200 South Street, Morristown, New Jersey, beginning at 7:32 p.m., prevailing time.

Council President Armington presiding.

Town Clerk Kevin D. Harris read the following statement: Notice of this meeting was provided in compliance with the Open Public Meetings Act in accordance with a Resolution adopted by the Council of the town of Morristown at the Organization Meeting on January 5, 2016 setting forth the time, date and location of each meeting. The Honorable Timothy P. Dougherty, Mayor was in attendance.

- D. Pledge of Allegiance – Council President Armington led the meeting in reciting the Pledge of Allegiance
- E. Consent Agenda – The Town Clerk presented the Consent Agenda consisting of the following items:

1. Request by St. Margaret's of Scotland Church to hold the annual Parish Carnival on August 25, 2016 through August 28, 2016.

Council President Armington made a motion that the items on the Consent Agenda be adopted which was seconded by Council Member Iannaccone.

**Motion to Suspend the Rules for Council  
To Discuss Tabled Items**

Council Member Harris moved that the Rules be suspended to allow for limited discussion on the tabled items. Council President Armington seconded the motion, and the motion passed on the following roll call:

Council engaged in discussion on the tabled items.

Council President Armington stated how the Ordinances would apply and how existing restaurants and establishments would be affected. Council President Armington asked for legal clarification. However, Council Member Harris asked if Council President Armington would go through each session this

evening. Town Attorney Vijayant Pawar, Esq., stated that it would have to be further researched. However, Mr. Pawar outlined how the Ordinance applies in terms of Land Use.

#### F. Public Hearing

- 1) **James Cavanaugh**, 9 Ashland Terrace, Chester, addressed Council concerning the proposed tabled ordinances and asked questions regarding establishments that may fall into different categories depending on the day of the week. Mr. Cavanaugh also addressed the "Gaffney" information that was provided to Council. Mr. Cavanaugh stated that his expert
- 2) **John Perry**, 54 Manor Drive, Basking Ridge, stated that he is a paid consultant and occasional Professor of Anthropology at William Paterson University in Wayne, New Jersey, addressed Council regarding information submitted to Council by Ms. Gaffney.
- 3) **Donna Gaffney**, 40 West Park Street, Morristown, thanked Mr. Perry for his comments, but stated that her information provided to Council was never intended to be a research document or an academic study, but was information that was compiled with the Morristown Police Department only as a resource for Council to search for more information.
- 4) **Tim Reuther**, 51 South Street, Morristown, stated that he read through the proposed Ordinances and that they are addressing issues that have not been put in place before to address problems and establish guidelines.
- 5) **Marie Rozan**, 40 West Park Street, Morristown, addressed Council with respects to the quality of life issues that are presented by bars.
- 6) **Margret Brady**, 1 Franklin Place, Morristown, thanked Council for drafting the proposed Ordinances. Ms. Brady stated that when she was a Council Member; there were problems that Council at the time that she served was unable to address because they did not have mechanisms similar to the Ordinances that Council is presently discussing.
- 7) **Jennifer Wehring**, Director of Marketing, Morristown Partnership, 14 Maple, Morristown, stated that Council should have a special meeting where Members of Council can discuss issues with the business owners who have licenses.

- 8) **Andrew Garing**, 3 Oldbrook Court, Rockaway, a local business owner stated that he does not have problems at his establishment and the proposed Ordinances would depreciate the value of the licenses he holds on his establishments. Mr. Garing further stated that it seems that many items on this Ordinance appear inconclusive.
- 9) **Cindy Geoffrey**, 27 Community Place, Morristown, requested that Council think hard to establish a hierarchy to clarify differences in categories as outlined earlier by Mr. Cavanaugh.
- 10) **Cindy Zimmer**, 16 Wetmore Avenue, Morristown, promotes the business and stated that the Ordinances would hinder business growth.

At this time the Council President opened the meeting to the public asking if there were any citizen or taxpayer who wished to be heard concerning any matter.

There appearing no one further to be heard, the Council President closed the public portion of the meeting.

#### G. Council Comments to Comments made during Public Hearing

Council Member Iannaccone stated that the proposed Ordinances are Zoning Ordinances. There is a process that the Ordinances must go through before they are adopted and implemented. Council Member Iannaccone stated that the purpose is to provide guidelines, not to bar business; but to ensure that businesses and the Town are harmoniously working together to ensure that all can enjoy privileges without one groups rights being trounced on.

Council Member Deeb stated that the Town's website should not be a forum for back and forth communication between residents. Council Member Deeb stated that she believes an annual, detailed, factual report from the Town's Police Department should address the issue.

Council Member Iannaccone stated that the Police Department does report crime statistics to the State Police and those statistics are public record. However, Council Member Iannaccone stated that this is a matter of density and should be worked with in conjunction with the Master Plan.

Council Member Harris addressed the correspondence provided by Ms. Gaffney and Mr. Cavanaugh. Council Member Harris stated that there should be public feedback before the Ordinances are introduced.

Mayor Dougherty prior to making comments introduced a young man by the name of Jameson McNamara who is a resident who lives in Morristown but shall soon be moving to New Castle, Delaware. The

Mayor stated that Master McNamara is remarkable because he loves Morristown and from a child's view that is good.

Presentation by Justin Protasiewicz of the Morristown Environmental Commission regarding the Foote's Pond Evaluation.

Mr. Protasiewicz along with Maureen Denmann who chairs the Environmental Commission provided details for the Council on what action and research the Environmental Commission has taken regarding Foote's Pond to be able to make the appropriate recommendations to Council as to how to proceed. Mr. Protasiewicz stated that among other things the Commission has been authorized to hire third party consultants to assist with many of the issues of concerned citizens and provide recommendations.

Mr. Protasiewicz stated that this process shall take a few months to complete; however, the Environmental Commission shall provide periodic detailed reports to Council.

After his presentation, Mr. Protasiewicz entertained questions and comments from Council Members.

Council Member Deeb asked what the scope was regarding the Commission's work with consultants and where the Commission is in that stage of development. Mr. Protasiewicz responded. Council Member Deeb asked if the Commission has the authority to choose consultants. Business Administrator Jillian C. Barrick stated that the Administration shall be working closely with the Commission. Council Member Deeb asked the the Princeton Hydrostudy needs to be updated. Mr. Protasiewicz responded that that study was limited in scope and more needs to be done. Council Member Deeb asked other questions with respects to dredging and

other issues that Mr. Protasiewicz provided answers to. Council Member Deeb inquired as to the Mr. Protasiewicz's qualifications.

Mayor Dougherty stated that the Princeton Hydro-study was a preliminary report and that a lot more needs to be done.

Council Member Harris asked Mr. Protasiewicz to again provide his qualifications to which Mr. Protasiewicz did and Mr. Protasiewicz stated that he felt that he brings a lot to the table. Council Member Harris thanked him for the report provided.

Mr. Robert C. Williams, Esq., West Orange, New Jersey addressed Council regarding the conditions imposed and informed the Council that in six years the Iron Bar has operated without a single violation and there has been no recommendation that the license should not be renewed. Mr. Williams stated that condition number 1 which required that no alcohol be served after 11:30 p.m., is restrictive and has never been imposed on any other license holder. Mr. Williams stated that the matter is now under review by the State Alcoholic Beverage Control. Mr. Williams stated that the Council has no legitimate consideration and Mr. Williams is asking Council to reconsider imposing that condition.

The Town Clerk asked if Mr. Williams was only appealing condition #1. Mr. Williams stated that is true and conditions 2 and 3 were never appealed.

Council Member Harris asked why was the condition imposed when not imposed on neighboring establishments operating under similar circumstances.

Council President Armington stated that the reason why there were no violations is because the expansion never opened and thus there was no way to gauge whether violations would have occurred.

Elnardo J. Webster, II, Esq., Assistant Municipal Attorney explained that the Iron Bar does have distinctions from other establishments. Mr. Webster cited objections to the Iron Bar where there was no objections to other establishments.

Council Member Harris still felt that the decision is arbitrary. Council President Armington stated that there has been no way to gauge because the establishment never opened.

Council Member Iannaccone stated that this facility was being opened as a separate restaurant and not as an expansion. Mr. Webster agreed. Council Member Iannaccone inquired as to the occupancy of both the Iron Bar and the Iron Bistro. Mr. Williams replied.

Council Member Iannaccone asked if the Resolution could be tabled and discussed in closed session in conjunction with the litigation. Mr. Webster stated that they could. Mr. Williams recommended that they vote tonight.
