A. Statement of Compliance with Open Public Meetings Act

Minutes of a regular meeting of the Town Council of the Town of Morristown, held on April 26, 2016, in the Council Room of the Morristown Town Hall located at 200 South Street, Morristown, New Jersey, beginning at 7:37 p.m., prevailing time.

Council President Armington presiding.

Town Clerk Kevin D. Harris read the following statement: Notice of this meeting was provided in compliance with the Open Public Meetings Act in accordance with a Resolution adopted by the Council of the town of Morristown at the Organization Meeting on January 5, 2016 setting forth the time, date and location of each meeting. A copy of the Resolution was distributed to the Morris County Daily Record and the Star Ledger, filed with the Town Clerk, posted on the Bulletin Board at the Municipal Building and mailed to any person who has requested and prepaid the established fee for such meeting notice.

- C. Moment of Silence – The Town Clerk asked the assembly to observe a moment of silence. Mayor Dougherty asked that the Assembly keep the Gariaro Family in prayer as Jack Gariaro lost his wife. The Town Clerk also informed the Assembly of the passing of Mayor Lizette Parker of Teaneck on April 24, 2016.

F. Public Hearing

1. Distribution and Presentation of the 2016 Budget of the Morristown Partnership Special Improvement District.

The Town Clerk informed the Council that the 2016 Budget of the Morristown Partnership Special Improvement District has been received by the Town Clerk and distributed to Council Members. The Town Clerk further informed the Council that the Morristown Partnership is seeking that their budget be approved for introduction this evening.

Jennifer Wehring, Director of Marketing for the Morristown Partnership, 14 Maple Avenue, Suite 201, Morristown, addressed the Council informing that in their packets; there are several items of collateral that were produced over the years 2014 and 2015 as well as the 2016 Budget which Ms. Wehring stated reflects an approximate 3.5% increase. Ms. Wehring stated that the Morristown Partnership's Assessment on Commercial Property accounts for approximately 50% of their annual revenue; and has been for approximately 20 years. Ms. Wehring further stated that the other 50% is raised entirely through sponsorship, event participation and collaborative advertising and that none of the assessment dollars are spent on community activities including, but not limited to "Restaurant Week" & "Meet Me in Morristown".

Ms. Wehring noted that one significant change is that the Partnership shall make a substantial investment in Downtown's Morristown's website which shall be robust, mobile adaptive and accessible for business owners without going through the Partnership's website.

Ms. Wehring distributed literature to the Council of upcoming events.

At this time the Council President opened the meeting to the public asking if there were any citizen or taxpayer who wished to be heard concerning this matter.

There appearing no one further to be heard, the Council President closed the public portion of the meeting as to this issue and thanked Ms. Wehring for coming and speaking.

2. Any other member of the public wishing to address Council on any issue.

At this time the Council President opened the meeting to the public asking if there were any citizen or taxpayer who wished to be heard concerning any matter. The Town Clerk advised members of the public to limit their comments to five minutes or less and that offensive and/or derogatory comments would be ruled out of order.

Don Hebert, Center for Addiction, Recovery & Success, 25 West Main Street, Rockaway, addressed Council regarding some of the activities that the Center is providing in Morristown. Mr. Hebert stated that the Center has received a grant from the State of New Jersey to provide free "Narcam" training and a free kit. Mr. Hebert stated that as of November, 630 people have been trained.

Alton Robinson, Center for Addiction, Recovery & Success, 25 West Main Street, Rockaway, stated that a satellite office has been opened in Morristown and other services shall be provided to help the citizens of Morristown. Mr. Robinson and Mr. Hebert provided Council with some information.

John Visconi, Esq., of McElroy, Deutsch, Mulvaney & Carpenter, representing the Morristown Licensed Beverage Association, which is a non-profit organization comprised of many local businesses who are licensed by the Town Council as the Municipality's ABC Board. Mr. Visconi informed Council that he was appearing with respects to the proposed Ordinance that would have amended the Land Use Ordinance affecting alcohol licensed establishments. Mr. Visconi stated that he believed that the Ordinance as written would be legally challenged and he offered the Council the Association's services in achieving the goals perhaps without the adoption of the ordinance. Council President Armington asked Mr. Visconi to provide his business card to the dais.

There appearing no one further to be heard, the Council President closed the public portion of the meeting.

G. Council Comments in Response to Comments Raised in Public Hearing.

Council President Armington addressed Mr. Visconi's comments stating that the Council is working closely with the Morristown Partnership in the preparation and modification of the proposed ordinance and encouraged Mr. Visconi to speak with the Partnership's representatives.

Council Member Harris stated that a separate meeting should be held because not all businesses are members of the Morristown Partnership.

H. Mayor's Proclamations and Presentations

1. Proclamation for Roger Harris on Life's Accomplishments – Mayor Dougherty presented a proclamation to Roger Harris on his educational accomplishments and acceptance into the New Jersey Army National Guard fulfilling a lifelong dream that was sidetracked by many of Life's obstacles. Mayor Dougherty also proclaimed Tuesday, April 26, 2016 as Roger Harris Day in the Town of Morristown.

Mr. Harris accepted the Proclamation and expressed thanks to Mayor Dougherty and Member of Council at which time Mr. Harris received a standing ovation from the Assembly.

I. Report of Mayor and Town Officials

Business Administrator Jillian Barrick stated that the budget has been presented; but a more formal presentation shall come at a later meeting and Ms. Barrick looks forward to addressing any questions and concerns.

Mayor Dougherty further stated that in 2016 totals \$52.1 million dollars and notes several areas that have substantially improved since he took office. Mayor Dougherty notes that Morristown's Budgetary Position is on more of a substantial footing due to efforts of the Administration to curb budgetary spending without cutting the level of services provided to citizens. Mayor Dougherty noted the decrease of the Municipal Tax Rate and a document that is fiscally sound.

Mayor Dougherty thanked the budget team and stated that he looked forward to working with Council to getting the Budget adopted.

2. Mayor Dougherty noted the flower on the lapel noting Mrs. Wilson's 40th Anniversary and that Marge Brady is being honored tonight and
3. Mayor Dougherty noted that the Grow it Green had its gala and stated that it was greatly attending and very rewarding to attend.
4. Mayor Dougherty thanked the Recreation Department for the Fishing Contest but noted the appearance of a large number of loons
5. Mayor Dougherty recognized Morristown National Little League which celebrated 65 years of operation.
6. Mayor Dougherty noted that there was a "Meeting of Mayors" hosted by the League of Women Voters. Mayor Dougherty noted that the Mayors of Randolph, Morris Plains, Morris Township and Morristown were all in attendance and he enjoyed the event.
7. Mayor Dougherty announced the recent ribbon cutting for the Morris Family Justice Center, at the County Administration Building, an agency for battered individuals and victims of domestic violence.

8. Mayor Dougherty announced that the Morris School District had its budget meeting on April 21, 2016.
9. Mayor Dougherty announced that Clean Communities had a great turnout at its annual Clean Up Day. Mayor Dougherty expressed thanks to Kathleen Margiotti and the volunteers who helped make it a success.
10. Mayor Dougherty announced the Arbor Day Celebration of Saturday, April 30, 2016, at 10:00 a.m., at Morristown High School.
11. Mayor Dougherty announced the ribbon cutting for the Horseshoe Tavern (formerly Veronica's) on Saturday, April 30, 2016 at 5:00 p.m.
12. Mayor Dougherty announced that on Monday, May 9, 2016, there would be a ribbon cutting ceremony for the American Hearing Center, 7 Macculloch Avenue in Morristown.
13. Mayor Dougherty expressed that the earthquake in Ecuador was series and there are several places in Morristown taking donations.
