H. Mayor's Presentation – Mayor Dougherty stated that he had no presentations for the evening.

I. Public Hearing

At this time, the Council President opened the meeting to members of the public, asking if there was anyone who wanted to address Council concerning any matter.

**Linda Carrington** – addressed the Council concerning the Town's Environmental Resource Inventory (hereafter "Inventory"). Ms. Carrington read for the Council select pages from the Inventory and made two (2) requests of the Council:

- (1) Review the list of invasive plant list and consider expanding it; and
- (2) Amend the application checklist used for zoning board applications to require the applications to consult the list when developing their landscape plan as a few zoning applications in the past had invasive species plants in the landscape plan.

Ms. Carrington provided a list to the Town Clerk for distribution to Council Members.

Mayor Dougherty addressed Mr. Carrington and advised Ms. Carrington to consult with the Chair of the Town's Environmental Commission as there may have been a conflict as to what is on the State of New Jersey's list versus what was on the Town's

list and as a result, the Chair of the Environmental Commission was doing very extensive research on the matter as well as consulting with a renowned expert. Mayor Dougherty requested that Council take no action until after Ms. Carrington has had an opportunity to consult with the Chair of the Environmental Commission.

**Chris Russo** – addressed the Council concerning the most recent fire on Elm Street and as a result; his organization Super Hero Events conducted a “fun run” to raise money for the Town to help people displaced by the fire. Mr. Russo presented an envelope containing \$ 2,120 in checks payable to the Town of Morristown to allow the Town to assist the victims. Mr. Russo further stated there was an outstanding check of \$180 which would make a grand total of \$ 2,300. He presented the envelope to Town Administrator Michael Rogers.

**Margaret Brady** – addressed the Council as a citizen member of the Parking Authority and stated she is offering her services as a resource to making things in the Town better.

**Carol Hubert** – asked Council to send the invasive plant list previously referred to by Ms. Carrington to the Town’s Shade Tree Commission as well.

**Bill Byrne** – addressed addressed the Council concerning traffic in that cars sometime ignore pedestrians in the crosswalks. He cited an instance when he was almost struck by an automobile and more to should be done to make motorists aware of the consequences.

With no other members of the public wishing to be heard; the Council President closed the public portion of the meeting.

Council President Feldman asked Town Attorney Vijayant Pawar, Esq., if there was any other information on the race. Mr. Pawar stated that he would follow up and speak with Mr. Russo in the morning.

Council President Feldman further stated that she would ask that Washington Avenue street paving be placed on the agenda for the next Council Meeting when hopefully Jeff Hartke, Director of Public Works and Town Engineer may be present.

#### K. Report of Mayor and Town Officials

Mayor Dougherty informed the Council as to the fire on Elm Street. Mayor Dougherty commended the fire department and commended the community on the outpouring of donations (i.e., coats, clothing and other items) that the Town cannot accept any more. Mayor Dougherty stated that these items will help many more residents of the Town than those displaced by the fire.

Mayor Dougherty informed all present that the coming weekend was predicted to be the coldest of the year and that all safety precautions should be taken.

With respects to monetary relief for the fire, Mayor Dougherty asked Mr. Michael Rogers, the Town Administrator to address the Council. Mr. Rogers advised that there was a resolution on the agenda for Council consideration to establish a Rider trust fund allowing the Town to deposit the monies and distribute them appropriately.

Council Member Deeb inquired as to eligibility and the verification process to ensure accountability. Council Member Deeb also questioned how the funds were to be distributed whether equally among those displaced or by some other methods. Council Member Deeb also asked if there is a formal policy that determines how funds are distributed

Mr. Rogers acknowledged that the individuals affected by the fire are advised to come to the Administration as soon as possible. Mr. Rogers stated that there is no written policy; however, each request for funds would be closely scrutinized and evaluated.

Council Member Smith-Reid asked if the funds would be distributed based solely on residential needs or would business needs be considered as well. She asked in the case of instances where the insurance is pending; would the Administration be willing to use the funds to assist those business.

Mr. Rogers stated that while addressing residential interest would be the primary of the Administration. The other requests (i.e., business relocation assistance) would be weighed. Mayor Dougherty stated that his Administration is out to help all affected.

As to the weather and snow, Mayor Dougherty stated that the DPW did a good job attempting to remove snow and put down salt so that individuals could get through Town.

Mayor Dougherty expressed extreme gratitude to Fire Chief Flanagan and the firefighters of the Morristown Fire Department on their efforts in fighting the fire. Mayor Dougherty stated that while sentimental, personal items were lost; the Fire Department managed to contain the fire and ensure that no severe injuries or loss of life occurred.

Council Feldman expressed thanks to both the Fire Department and the Administration as well for their efforts and for sharing information on the Town's website about fire prevention.

Council Member Deeb reminded the Mayor and the Fire Chief about a fire prevention seminar on February 17, 2015 in the Senior Center. Fire Chief Flanagan stated that the seminar shall be at 7:30 p.m., in the Senior Center at Town Hall.

Council Member Harris suggested to Mayor Dougherty both Homeless Solutions and the Women's Shelter as possible recipients for items donated to fire victims once all fire victims have been assisted.

N. Unfinished (Old) Business

1. Abbett/Ridgedale/I-287 – Council Member Smith-Reid that there is a bottleneck at this intersection and because of traffic patterns; it is difficult to navigate that area. Council Member Smith-Reid questioned if time of day was a factor. She inquired whether the Administration is interested in attempting to alleviate the matter.

Mr. Rogers invited Director of Public Works and Town Engineer Jeff Hartke to the microphone to address the issue. Director Hartke stated that in 2008 there was a study done. Mr. Hartke had a meeting with the NJ Department of Transportation and that the issue has been identified and he is hoping with NJDOT assistance to alleviate the problems in NJDOT making changes to their traffic signal and the Town making changing to its curb layout.

2. Council President Feldman thanked the Administration for providing information on the Form Based Code and stated that the information as well as the discussion in the Planning Board meeting is on the Town's website.
3. Council President Feldman stated that any Council Member interested may attend the long range Planning Committee meeting. However, she stated that Council can take additional actions through subcommittees and/or advisory committees. Council President Feldman thanked Mr.

Pawar for providing the Council with their options and the Council President sought feedback from the Council as to their thoughts.

No comments were offered. Council President requested that a resolution be placed on the next agenda for a subcommittee. Town Attorney Mr. Pawar stated that could be done.

Council Member Deeb inquired as to why there is a need for subcommittees. Mr. Pawar stated that this is in the Code of the Town of Morristown. Council Member Deeb asked if Council Member Armington as liaison to the Planning Board is willing to come to Council and provide constant updates. Council Member Armington answered in the affirmative.

- O. New Business – Council Member Armington questioned whether the Town Code may be changed to allow light boating, kayaking and canoeing on Speedwell Lake. Council Member Armington stated a U.S. Army Corps of Engineers report that was published in November 2014. Based on the report, Council Member Armington stated that based on the report if an ordinance could be presented.

Mayor Dougherty asked the Administration could have time to conduct research and he would report back at the next meeting.

Council Member Deeb expressed concern about warnings for the waterfall and the liability that the Town may face. Council Member Smith-Reid stated that she believed that that waterfall goes in the opposite direction.

On an aside issue, Mayor Dougherty asked Council Member Armington was aware of anything that the Morris County Park Commission have offered to Willow Hall for walkway on the lake. Council Member Armington stated his was not aware of anything. Council Member Armington stated that he raised the issue with commissioners and while they seemed interested; they have not offered anything formal.
