
Fire Chief Gary S. Desjadon retired from the Town of Morristown effective June 1, 2011 after 26 years of service.







After graduation, he attended college seminary at Seton Hall University, where he received a Bachelor of Arts in French in 1977. Msgr. Hart completed his priesthood studies at Immaculate Conception Seminary, Darlington and earned a Masters of Art in Theology with a concentration in Sacred Scripture; and

WHEREAS, Msgr. Hart was ordained to the priesthood at Annunciation Parish by Bishop Frank J. Rodimer on May 9, 1981. After ordination, he was assigned to Corpus Christi Parish. In 1987 Father John was assigned to full-time service in the Diocesan Tribunal. In 1988 he began advanced studies in canon law at St. Paul University, Ottawa, Canada where he earned his J.C.L.
