Systematic Pruning

- Potential areas are currently being surveyed to determine the number of trees and where the volume of requests are coming from.

Tree Crew Activity Highlights for Month of August

- Removed trees overhanging Lidgerwood Park pumphouse
- Removed uprooted tree at 49 Overlook
- Repaired stubs on pine trees in Gramby Park
- Made dead white oak safe in Burnham Park natural area
- Removed large Ash at the south end of Burnham Park
- Removed extensive deadwood in tree on Cutler St
- Removed down hanging branches on Cutler St since crew was on the street
- Started to remove the vines from pine trees in Ford Hill Park

- A. Bank Street - still pending
ACTION: KA to email James Campbell regarding status
- B. 7 Elm - tree is protected
- C. Sick/dead tree at Burnham Park - update in report
- D. Fall planting - Cottage and Jersey plantings, Maple Ave planned. Expect bids soon.
- E. systematic pruning - budget is separate from STC budget, \$60,000 budget.
 - a. Purpose of systematic pruning is to ensure trees are properly pruned every 5-6 years to avoid damage in future due to storms.
 - b. 400 trees can be pruned with this budget per year
 - c. This is the fourth year of systematic pruning. Arborist proposal deviates from initial intention of systematic pruning plan. Commission okay with deviation, but plan needs to be updated to ensure change is captured for future pruning cycles.
 - d. KA has been tracking systematic pruning locations over last three years. General agreement that Arborist can proceed with pruning as currently planned.
ACTION: Future meetings to focus on future systematic pruning planning to ensure a 5 or 6-year cycle covers entirety of town and avoid over-pruning.

 - a. timing - please send at least 3 business days prior to meeting
 - b. context - please provide pictures, specific location of tree(s) being referenced.

6. Resident Tree Issues

- A. Deer protection
 - a. RJ, KA, and SL protected 30 new trees in Burnham Park.
- B. 60 Franklin Street
 - a. Private ash tree that was dead. Hung over public right-of-way. KA and RN notified town and visited owners. Has been removed.
- C. 21 Kenmuir Ave
 - a. Dead tree - weed-whacker damage. Resident will pay for a replacement tree.
- D. Kenmuir dying trees
 - a. salt, over-fertilizing, weed-whacker, still unknown why trees are dying?
ACTION: PZ to start draft flyer on how to care for street trees. Input from commission welcome. Tree planting planned in 2022 - how to care for trees:
 - encourage mulch around trees
 - landscapers and weed-whackers
 - minimize salt
 - minimize chemicals.
 - shade tree core training materials?

7. Invasive

- A. Ash removal – tree crew Park status - focusing on Burnham Park. Status unknown.

8. Parks Report

- A. Jacob Ford – invasive vine removal from pine trees in process.
- B. Lidgerwood
 - a. invasive remediation section in process. invasives removed and new plantings planned.
 - b. SM noted flood mitigation work, improved drainage planned.
ACTION: KA / SM to verify with town administration regarding planned work and potential impact on work in Lidgerwood.
 - c. Lidgerwood gazebo planned - Rotary club donation. Any additional funding for replantings after invasives are gone? AO mentioned it to Rotary is open to ideas - need details.

ACTION: SL to draw up planting plans and present to Rotary to see if the group would be willing to fund any new plantings, or develop invasive strike force. Develop "Community Days" every 3-4 months. SL to write up proposal.

- C. Jersey Cottage Park
 - a. removing invasives, remove invasives in forest area, opening up trees for future growth.
 - b. seeds for forested area to be thrown down - pine needles to be added.
 - c. J. Porter Community Tree Project Award - Grant for \$2,500 awarded.
ACTION: KA to take "Before" photos in advance of removal work.
- D. Forested areas of Morristown
 - a. Each Commissioner is asked to pick a park to sponsor / steward
 - b. KA to attend October Town Council meeting to call the Council to action to pay attention to parks
 - i. issues with vine smothering, issues with invasives - outside of maintained areas, forested areas.
 - ii. Requested Action: Ask for trained volunteers to help mitigate vines on trees and address invasives to save our urban forest areas surrounding our parks.

9. Business District

- A. Parking Lot Ordinance
 - a. RB / KA have been advocating an ordinance requiring trees for every ~5 parking spots. Final details being decided with the Town.
- B. Hampshire Real Estate on Maple
 - a. stone in median strip - heats up ground and root system. Request to remove the stone around the trees and replace with mulch.
ACTION: KA to follow up with Hampshire Real Estate about mulch installation.
- C. Flexipave to include tree wells on Cattano and Morris St.
 - a. Parking authority to reimburse flexipave cost back to Town.
 - b. contract awarded to Midwest Construction, \$20,000 + \$27,650 (tree well widening and flexipave)
ACTION: KA and SM to confirm scope of flexipave - should include 43-47 tree wells
- D. biochar 2021 – planned for Morris Street - pushed to next year.
 - a. Town Engineer opening up wells to be 4'x8' along Morris Street - see above.

 - a. this grant will pay for a new tree inventory for street and parks/Tree Plotter program for Town use and ultimately for tree crew to have tablets in the field to record their work
