Town of Morristown Awards \$100,000 in Opioid Settlement Funds to Mrs. Wilson's Treatment Center

MORRISTOWN, NJ – At its regular meeting on September 9, 2025, the Morristown Town Council approved a resolution authorizing the award of \$100,000 in opioid settlement funds to Mrs. Wilson's Treatment Center, a nonprofit organization dedicated to providing comprehensive treatment and housing for women struggling with substance use and co-occurring mental health disorders.

This funding comes from the National Opioid Settlement, which allocates resources to local governments to support prevention, treatment, and recovery initiatives in communities impacted by the opioid epidemic. The Town's award will directly support Mrs. Wilson's evidence-based programs, which have served women in the Morristown area for over four decades.

To commemorate the award, Mayor Tim Dougherty will present a ceremonial check for \$100,000 to representatives from Mrs. Wilson's Treatment Center on Monday, September 15, 2025 at 3:30 PM at Mrs. Wilson's Treatment Center located at 56 Mt. Kemble Avenue, Morristown.

The event will highlight the Town's ongoing commitment to supporting community-based recovery services and will celebrate the important work being done locally to address the ongoing effects of the opioid crisis.

"The opioid epidemic has affected countless families and individuals in our community," said **Mayor Tim Dougherty**. "Mrs. Wilson's Treatment Center provides critical services to women working toward recovery, and we're proud to support their mission with this funding."

Mrs. Wilson's Treatment Center is a licensed nonprofit offering residential and outpatient treatment for women recovering from addiction and trauma. The organization provides a safe, supportive environment where women can heal, rebuild, and thrive.
